TOPIC AND PURPOSE

This report is intended to provide the Executive Committee with an update on the Remai Art Gallery of Saskatchewan project.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

- 1. EllisDon has taken control of the site.
- 2. Construction has started.

STRATEGIC GOAL(S)

This project supports the City of Saskatoon's Quality of Life Strategic Goal, relating to the implementation of the Municipal Culture Plan. It supports the 4 Year Priority to enhance the quality of life in Saskatoon by directing expenditures toward amenities in neighbourhoods to enhance and protect property values and encourage private investment.

<u>REPORT</u>

The construction update on the Remai Art Gallery of Saskatchewan project is as follows:

- A pre-construction start-up meeting was held April 18, 2013 at the EllisDon office to outline roles, responsibilities and administrative procedures
- The site has been prepared for construction including:
 - Installation of site fencing
 - Installation of site trailers
 - Additional site signage relating to detours and routing is underway and will be installed in River Landing by city forces.
- Site Drilling required for the caisson construction prior to the excavation is underway. Some concrete has been encountered along the north end of the site along Saunders Drive.
- Monthly site meetings, with the contractor, design team and owner team, to occur during the initial excavation and foundation construction phases. Following this, meetings to occur biweekly.
